

Introduction

This report gives headline findings from the National Survey of Third Sector Organisations (NSTSO), conducted by Ipsos MORI on behalf of the Office of the Third Sector. It provides you with the overall results for each question in the survey for Barking and Dagenham.

The National Survey of Third Sector Organisations was conducted amongst third sector organisations (TSOs) across 149 upper tier local authorities in England from September to December 2008.

Full detail of the methodology and other technical details for the research are included at the end of this report.

How to use this report

What these data represent

This report gives you the headline findings from each question of the NSTSO in your area – that is, how TSOs in your area responded to the survey. Answers are provided at aggregate level up so that it isn't possible to identify particular organisations.

Gaining insight from the data

These data should give you a good picture of what TSOs in your area think. Some answers maybe more revealing than others. Be mindful of the difference between figures which may be striking in themselves (perhaps higher or lower than you expected) and those which – in the view of the respondents themselves – are most important in shaping whether it is a good area to work in. The analytical report, which is published alongside this, is designed to help you here; by scanning the data at a national level to look for patterns we have identifies responses might be key drivers of respondents' overall views on the area. For instance, an area might have a low result on one question, but in fact that doesn't impact heavily on respondents overall view of how supporting local partners are. By contract, small fluctuations in answers to a different question might be much more important in showing what lies behind respondents' overall views.

Delving further into the data

Having seen what the headline answers are in your area, you may want to explore specific issues in greater detail. For this you should return to the main site. There are three parts to exploring the data:

- 1) Pick the questions and answers you most want to explore. We strongly recommend that you start with the issues we have highlighted as being most influential in determining TSOs' overall answers, as described above; these should be some of the most illuminating figures to explore. You may also identify other questions of your choosing to consider.
- 2) Compare local and national scores. Having considered the questions you want to explore, you should compare your local scores with the national scores for the same question. You can do this in the "Local Authority / National Comparison" tool. This should help you put your scores into a wider perspective, and help see how they are affecting overall views in the area.
- 3) Compare one answer with another. In many cases, we can gain an insight into what underlies the results of one question by cross-referring to the answers to other questions. So we might want to know whether TSOs who were satisfied they had enough staff expressed higher levels of satisfaction with particular aspects of their local area – with local support, or with local guidance, or funding and access to finance. You can see these relationship by using the 'cross-analysis' tool.



About the data

Unless otherwise stated, the number of respondents answering each question is: 131

Data from the survey have been weighted within each local authority to ensure results are representative of the make up of TSOs in that authority (according to organisational type).

Where percentages do not add up to 100% this can be due to a variety of factors – such as multiple responses or computer rounding the decimal points up or down.

Sampling tolerances

For this research a sample, rather than the entire population, was surveyed and therefore the percentages in this survey are subject to sampling tolerances – which vary with the size of the population, the size of the sample and the percentage figure concerned. The National Survey of Third Sector Organisations was conducted amongst third sector organisations (TSOs) across 149 upper tier local authorities in England from September to December 2008.

In total 104,391 TSOs across all 149 single and two-tier authorities in England were invited to participate in the survey. Initially pre-notice letters were mailed to all selected organisations (along with a link enabling them to access the survey online). Paper questionnaires were then mailed to all selected organisations shortly afterwards. Thank you/reminder postcards and reminder questionnaires were also sent out to organisations, with telephone reminders conducted with a sample of non-responding organisations. TSOs were able to complete the survey either online or on paper throughout the fieldwork period.

Sampling

A database of TSOs drawing on the list of registered charities and registers of Community Interest Companies, Companies Limited by Guarantee and Industrial and Provident Societies in England, was supplied by Guidestar UK.

Calculations were conducted to obtain the ideal number of TSOs required to be asked to complete the survey to achieve robustness. In some areas a census survey was conducted (i.e. all TSOs were asked to take part), and in others a sample of TSOs were selected from within specific stratifiers. Organisation type (registered charity, CIC, CLG or IPS) was the main stratifier. Registered charities were further stratified according to income.

Sampling tolerances

For this research a sample, rather than the entire population, was surveyed and therefore the percentages in this survey are subject to sampling tolerances – which vary with the size of the sample and the percentage figure concerned.

A common way to express statistical reliability is to express sample tolerance in terms of confidence intervals. However, it is important to note that in principle, sample tolerances can only be calculated when data have been collected through a pure random probability sample. For this research it was necessary to use a self-selecting postal survey and therefore it is not possible to be definitive about any sample tolerances, and any quoted in this report may well be larger and must only be treated as broadly indicative. Moreover, it is also important to note that sampling tolerances are affected by weighting. The effect of the weighting has been taken into account in the indicative calculations detailed below.
